Annual Brindis Luncheon – Main fundraising event and opportunity to acknowledge Adelita's, Amigos and Latina student scholars.

Scholarship Programs – Since 1996 MANA has awarded \$158,0000 in scholarships to 138 deserving Latinas.

Hermanitas Program - Provides opportunities for growth through the mentorship of our young Latinas by Latina leaders from all arenas: education, government, political, business and community. The programs encourage young Latinas to stay in school and achieve high academic performance and helps to develop the talents and skills of young Latinas in elementary, middle and high school through educational and leadership programs. This year we sponsored two events: **Take your MANA to Work Day – April 27th**, an opportunity where 35 high school students toured GM's Factory Zero Plant and leadership discussed electric vehicles; the students also attended a networking lunch; **herMANA Listas Conference – May 20th**, an interactive day session for Latina girls and parents that focused on areas of financial literacy, home ownership, education/college preparedness, immigration and signs of domestic violence. Additionally, we have a new ongoing mentorship program, the **TIA Program** where professional MANA members are teamed with young scholars for mentorship opportunities.

Keynote Speaker Mary Cavanagh, Michigan State Senator



Mary Cavanagh, Democrat, was elected to the Michigan State Senate in November 2022 after serving in the State House of Representatives. She has been appointed to serve as Assistant Majority Whip for the 102nd Legislature from 2023-2027, making her the youngest Latina to be elected to the Michigan Senate and to be serving in a leadership role. She araduated from Wayne

State University with a bachelor's degree in physical anthropology. She has over twenty years of civic engagement experience, political and community organizing, and social activism. She is an alumna of the National Students Leadership Conference in Washington D.C. and is a precinct delegate for Redford Township and former City Year AmeriCorps Member.

She currently also serves on the Executive Board of the Michigan Democratic Women's Caucus, Commissioner on Redford's Diversity and Inclusion Commission, Member-at-Large for the Michigan's Democratic Youth Caucus, and active member of the Redford Chamber of Commerce, Livonia Lion's Club, and Redford Jaycees. Senator Cavanagh is the current Chair of the Michigan Legislative Latino Caucus, Vice Chair of the Progressive Women's Caucus and sits on Labor, Firearms and Safety, Poverty and Homeless, and the Michigan Legislative Black Caucus.

Senator Cavanagh serves as Chair of the Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) / Michigan Economic Development (MEDC) Appropriation Subcommittee and the Licensing & Regulatory Affairs (LARA) / Department of Insurance & Financial Services (DIFS) Senate Appropriations Subcommittees. She also is the Chair of the Finance, Insurance, and Consumer Protection and Vice Chair of the Community Development and Senate standina Economic committees. Senator Cavanagh will also be serving on the following standing committees; full Appropriations, Housing and Human and Appropriations Services. Labor: subcommittees; and Department of Health and Human Services and Pre-K -12.

Tanya is currently the Global Director of Implementation & Operations for the TripWise Solution at Sirva.

Throughout her career, Tanya has committed to several extracurricular activities such as serving on the Executive Board and\or Committee of the Maltese American Benevolent Society, Inc. for over 30 years, the Most Holy Trinity Catholic Church's Annual Children's Christmas Party Committee Chair servicing 500 Southwest Detroit children annually and now MANA as Treasurer since 2022. The State of Michigan recognized Tanya's leadership by awarding her the Maltese American Community Leader Award in September of 2021 and Most Holy Trinity Awarded her the Good Samaritan Award in March of 2019.

She earned a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration, a Master of Education in Educational Leadership, and most recently, a Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies

from Wayne State University (WSU). Her dedication to higher education and passion for student success is reflected in her years of experience as an Admissions Counselor at WSU's Office Admissions. of Undergraduate Providina educational opportunities to students and contributing to their advancement has been one of her highest objectives. As the past chair of WSU's Latinx Faculty and Staff Association and various other initiatives across campus, Vanessa has demonstrated her influence to enhance diversity and inclusion across the university. Her efforts have expanded beyond WSU, currently serving as cochair of the board for Advocates for Latino Student Advancement in Michigan Education, a non-profit organization committed to making college education a reality for Latino students across the state, and as a member of the Michigan Association for College Admission Counseling Conference Planning Committee. Her commitment to this career is empowered by the encouragement she gives to hundreds of students to pursue higher education and the mission of her alma mater to prepare a diverse student body to thrive.



2023 Adelita Award Recipient Gabriela Santiago-Romero



Gabriela Santiago-Romero Detroit City Council Member for District 6

Gabriela is an immigrant from Mexico and a Southwest Detroit native. She's the former Policy and Research Director at We The People Michigan based in Detroit. She earned her Master of Social Work, studying social policy and evaluation with a focus on community and social systems from the University of Michigan. She has made history by becoming the first out female LGBTQ Detroit councilmember and serves on the Budget, Finance & Audit Standing Committee and is the first Latina chair of the Public Health & Safety Committee. She's a community activist and organizer who has extensive experience working for Detroit nonprofits and local government. Love and food fuel her work.





Raymond Lozano is Executive Director of the Mexicantown Community Development Corporation. The organization formed 1989 has been providing in business and community development programming and cultural activities to Southwest Detroit for the destination that is known as "Mexicantown". In 2016, Ray was a Case Manager for the Michigan Veteran's Foundation in Detroit and was responsible for identifying and locating resources to help improve the lives of Detroit area 's homeless veterans. Ray is also a veteran, having served with

the U.S. Army's 1st of the 50th Mechanized Infantry division in Vietnam, Southeast Asia as part of the 173rd Airborne Brigade. Prior to his role with the Veteran's Foundation, Ray served as Division Manager for New Detroit Incorporated, a race equity organization formed in 1967. He was responsible for working with New Detroit's programs in addressing issues involving race relations, immigration, and social and economic equity. From 2005 to 2010, Ray was the Executive Director of the Michigan Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, a regional business association serving the Hispanic community and consisting of over 300 small and corporate businesses. Ray also previously worked at DTE Energy, serving as a Market Executive with DTE Electric's Ethnic Marketing Department and as Statewide Manager of community and local government affairs for DTE's Gas Company. Ray has a long history of community service and currently serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors for SER Metro Detroit. He is also Chairman of the Wayne County Economic Development Corporation and the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority. He has also served a six-year appointment on the National Advisory Board for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in Washington D.C. and a six-year term as a Trustee at Madonna University. Ray also served a two-year term as President of the Mexican Consulate's Centro Mexicano de Michigan. Ray has received recognition from the U.S. Small Business Administration as a Minority Small Business Champion and the American Association of Blacks in Energy with the Lewis H. Latimer Award. He has also received both the City of Detroit-Outstanding Corporate Advocate Award and the Wayne County Distinguished Service Award. He was also honored with the Fr. Kern Foundation Medallion for his Service to the Community. Ray is a native Detroiter and graduate of Wayne State University's School of Education. He and his wife Christie are residents of the Boston Edison Historic District in Detroit

SCHOLARSHIPS

MANA de Metro Detroit Scholarship

MANA de Metro Detroit Scholarship Program was established in 1996 and has been providing scholarships for Latina women on annual basis. As of 2022, MANA de Metro Detroit has awarded one-hundred thirty-eight scholarships. Scholarship awards may cover educational expenses such as tuition, books and school related supplies. Eligibility includes enrollment in a higher education institution, vocational/career training, or leadership program and a resident of the Metro Detroit area.

Carmen Muñoz Entrepreneurship Scholarship

Carmen Muñoz Crites was born and raised in Southwest Detroit. A strong and tenacious woman, Carmen decided early in life that her fate and the opportunity for success and failure would rest in her hands. That determination led Carmen to an entrepreneurial path that included building her company, Muñoz Machine Products, into a leading automotive supplier that was recognized throughout the industry for quality and service. Although she became an accomplished businesswoman, Carmen believed true success as achieved by improving the lives of others and giving back to the community where she was raised. This scholarship was created to honor Carmen's life and encourage Latina women to continue her legacy of entrepreneurism and community engagement.

Monica L. Martinez Leadership Scholarship

Monica Martinez served as a compassionate advocate and voice for the underserved families, neighborhoods, entrepreneurs, business owners and communities throughout her career. She was also instrumental in providing funding for the MANA scholarships and for the Hermanitas program. This scholarship was established to honor her legacy.

Dr. Ellen Ochoa STEM Scholarship

Ellen Ochoa became the first Latina to go to space when she served on a nine-day mission aboard the shuttle Discovery in 1993. Due to Dr. Ochoa's pioneering spirit in the sciences, MANA is proud to name the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) scholarship in her honor.
